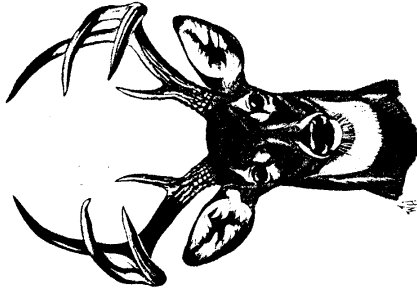

This brochure is designed to provide the public with information and a summary of regulations pertaining to hunting and other recreational use on the Blackwater Wildlife Management Area. **Regulations that are new or differ substantially from last year are shown in bold print.** Area users should familiarize themselves with all regulations. For exact wording of the wildlife laws and regulations, see the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's wildlife code, on file with the Secretary of State and state libraries. This brochure, the Florida Hunting Regulations handbook, and quota permit worksheets should provide the information necessary for you to plan your hunting activities. These publications are available from any Commission office, county tax collector and at MyFWC.com.

Persons using wildlife management areas are required to have appropriate licenses, permits and stamps. The following persons are exempt from all license and permit requirements (except for quota permits listed as "no exemptions", recreational use permits, antlerless deer permits and the Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamp [duck stamp]): Florida residents who are 65 years of age or older; residents who possess a Florida Resident Disabled Person Hunting and Fishing Certificate; residents in the U.S. Armed Forces, not stationed in Florida, while home on leave for 30 days or less, upon submission of orders; and children under 16 years of age. Children under 16 years of age are exempt from the duck stamp. Anyone born on or after June 1, 1975 and 16 years of age or older must have passed a Commission-approved hunter-safety course prior to being issued a hunting license, except the Hunter Safety Mentoring exemption allows anyone to purchase a hunting license and hunt under the supervision of a licensed hunter, 21 years of age or older, for one year.

Hunting, trapping and fishing licenses, and management area, archery, muzzleloading gun, wild turkey and state waterfowl permits may be purchased from county tax collectors, license agents, at MyFWC.com/license or by telephone at 1-888-486-8356. A no-cost Migratory Bird Permit is available when purchasing a hunting license. Any waterfowl hunter 16 years of age or older must possess a federal duck stamp; available where hunting licenses are sold, at most post offices or at duckstamp.com. Americans with Disabilities Act accessibility information is available at MyFWC.com/ADA.

QUOTA PERMIT INFORMATION:

Note – the Blackwater General Gun Dog hunt quota permits are transferable.

General Gun Still (first thirteen days and last seventeen days) - 1800, no-cost, quota permits.

General Gun Dog - 400, no-cost, quota permits for each of 2 hunts.

Family Still Hunt - 50, no-cost, quota permits (no exemptions).

Archery/Muzzleloading Gun (field trial area) - 75, no-cost, quota permits.

Quail (field trial area) - 3 group permits (up to 2 hunters per group), no-cost, quota permits (no exemptions) for each of 2 hunts.

Permit applications: Hunters must submit electronic applications for quota and special-opportunity permits through the Commission's Total Licensing System (TLS) at a license agent, county tax collector's office or MyFWC.com. Worksheets listing hunts, application periods, deadlines and instructions are available at county tax collector's offices, FWC offices or MyFWC.com. The first quota application period begins June 1 and worksheets will be available about two weeks prior.

Additional hunters: A quota permit holder (host) may bring only one additional hunter. This additional hunter must be a youth under 16 years of age, a youth supervisor (if quota permit holder is a youth), a mentor license holder, mentor

license supervisor (if applicable) or guest permit holder. The additional hunter does not receive a separate bag limit. The host must share a bag limit with the guest and the host is responsible for violations that exceed the bag limit. The guest and host must enter and exit the area together and must share a street-legal vehicle while hunting on the area. The guest may only hunt while the host is on the area.

Guest permits: One guest permit may be issued for each archery, muzzleloading gun, general gun, wild hog, spring turkey and mobility impaired quota permit issued through the Commission's TLS. A guest permit is not issued to a youth under 16, a youth supervisor, a mentor license holder or a mentor license supervisor. A person is only eligible for one guest permit per hunt. Guest permits may only be obtained from license agents or county tax collector's offices. Guest permits may be obtained up to and during the last day of the hunt. Refer to the quota hunt worksheets for additional information.

Youth and mentor license holders: A youth hunter (less than 16 years of age) must be supervised by a person at least 18 years of age. A mentor license holder must be supervised by a licensed hunter at least 21 years of age. Unless exempt, only those supervisors with proper licenses and permits may hunt. If the supervisor is hunting during any hunt (not including special-opportunity) for which quota permits are issued, at least one person in the party must be in possession of a quota permit. During a hunt that allows exemptions, a non-exempt supervisor of a youth must have a quota permit to hunt. A non-hunting supervisor is allowed to accompany a youth or mentor license holder during any hunt (including special-opportunity).

Transfer of permits: Quota and guest permits are not transferable (except the general gun dog quota permits). Except for youth under 16 years of age, a positive form of identification is required when using a non-transferable permit. The sale or purchase of any quota permit, guest permit or antlerless deer permit is prohibited.

GENERAL AREA REGULATIONS:

All general laws and regulations relating to wild animal life or freshwater aquatic life shall apply unless specifically exempted for this area. Hunting or the taking of wildlife or fish on this area shall be allowed only during the open seasons and in accordance with the following regulations:

1. Any person hunting deer or accompanying another person hunting deer shall wear at least 500 square inches of daylight fluorescent-orange material as an outer garment, above the waistline. This is not required during an archery-only season.
2. Taking of spotted fawn, swimming deer or roosted turkey is prohibited. Species legal to take are listed under each season.
3. It is illegal to hunt over bait or place any bait or other food for wildlife on this area.
4. Driving a metal object into any tree, or hunting from a tree into which a metal object has been driven, is prohibited.
5. No person shall cut, damage or remove any natural, man-made or cultural resource without written authorization of the landowner or primary land manager.
6. Taking or attempting to take any game with the aid of live decoys, recorded game calls or sounds, set guns, artificial light, net, trap, snare, drug or poison is prohibited.
7. The wanton and willful waste of wildlife is prohibited.

8. Hunting, fishing or trapping is prohibited on any portion of the area posted as "CLOSED" to those activities.
9. People, dogs, vehicles and other recreational equipment are prohibited in areas posted as "Closed to Public Access" by FWC administrative action.
10. Taking or herding wildlife from any motorized vehicle, aircraft or boat, which is under power is prohibited until power, and movement from that power, has ceased.
11. Most game may be hunted from one-half hour before sunrise until one-half hour after sunset (see exceptions for each season).
12. The release of any animal is prohibited, without written authorization of the landowner or primary land manager.
13. The head and evidence of sex may not be removed from the carcass of any deer or turkey on the area.
14. The planting or introduction of any non-native plant is prohibited, without written authorization of the landowner or primary land manager.
15. Wild hog may not be transported alive.
16. It is unlawful for any person to leave any garbage or refuse or in any way litter in the area.
17. It is unlawful to set fire to any forest, grass or woodlands.
18. A Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Law Enforcement Officer may search any camp, vehicle or boat, in accordance with law.

PUBLIC ACCESS AND VEHICLES:

1. Open to public access year-round.
2. A marked footpath called the Florida Trail traverses the area. This trail is open to hikers throughout the year.
3. **Vehicles may be operated only on named and numbered roads, except south of State Road 4 and east of County Road 191 where vehicles may be operated only on established roads.**
4. The Florida Gas Transmission Line is closed to public vehicular traffic.
5. Vehicles may not be operated in the Environmental Enhancement Area from March 1 through September 30.
6. Florida traffic laws relating to vehicles and vehicle operators apply on this area. The operation of an unregistered and unlicensed vehicle is prohibited.
7. The use of airboats, tracked vehicles or ATVs on this area is prohibited, except by permit from the Florida Division of Forestry.
8. Parked vehicles may not obstruct a road, gate or firelane.
9. No motor vehicle shall be operated on any part of any wildlife management area that has been designated as closed to vehicular traffic.

HUNTERS AND CHECK STATIONS:

1. Hunting equipment and dogs may be taken onto the WMA after 8 a.m. the day before the opening of a season and shall be removed by 6 p.m. one day after the end of the season.
2. Public deer-cleaning and carcass-disposal facilities are located adjacent to the Forest Headquarters in Munson (see map).

GUNS:

1. All firearms shall be securely encased and in a vehicle, vessel, camper or tent, during periods when they are not a legal method of take. Persons in possession of a valid Concealed Weapon or Firearm License may carry concealed handguns.
2. Target practice is prohibited.
3. Hunting wildlife or the display or use of a gun in a manner capable of taking wildlife on or from the rights-of-way of State Roads 2, 4, 191 and 189; U.S. 90; County Road 180; Carpenter Road from County Road 191 to Juniper Creek; Forest Roads 6, 23, 25, 31, 47, 48, 72 or 86 and the paved portions of Forest Roads 2, 9 and 57 is prohibited.
4. The discharge of any gun within 300 yards of any public campsite is prohibited.
5. Hunting with a gun and light is prohibited (see Fox, Raccoon, Opossum and Bobcat Season for exceptions).
6. Muzzleloading guns used for taking deer must be .40 caliber or larger, if firing a single bullet, or be 20 gauge or larger if firing two or more balls.
7. Children under the age of 16 may not be in possession of a firearm unless in the presence of a supervising adult.
8. No person shall have a gun under control while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
9. For hunting non-migratory game, only shotguns, rifles, pistols, longbows (including compound and recurve bows), crossbows (during the general gun, small game, family hunt and spring turkey seasons or by permit) or falconry may be used.
10. For hunting migratory game, only shotguns, bow and arrow (not crossbows), and falconry may be used. Shotguns shall not be larger than 10 gauge and shall be incapable of holding more than three shells in the magazine and chamber combined.
11. Firearms using rimfire or non-expanding, full metal jacket (military ball) ammunition are prohibited for taking deer.
12. Fully automatic or silencer-equipped firearms, centerfire semi-automatic rifles having a magazine capable of holding more than five rounds, explosive or drug-injecting devices and setguns are prohibited.

DOGS:

1. Hunting deer with dogs is allowed in the dog hunt area during the General Gun Dog season only.
2. Hunting with dogs, other than bird dogs or retrievers, is prohibited in the still hunt area and during general gun still and family hunt seasons in the dog hunt area;

however, dogs with a shoulder height of 15 inches or less may be used to take small game during small game seasons in both the still hunt and dog hunt areas.

3. Bird dogs may be trained throughout the year except during the spring turkey season and in the field trial area. Dogs are prohibited in the field trial area, except as specifically authorized by permit, or during the bird dog training (October 1-15 and November 14-30), dove, or quail hunting seasons.
4. No person shall allow any dog to pursue or molest any wildlife during any period in which the taking of wildlife by the use of dogs is prohibited.
5. Dogs on leashes may be used for trailing wounded game.
6. For purposes other than hunting, dogs are allowed, but must be kept under physical restraint at all times.
7. Dogs are prohibited in areas posted as "CLOSED TO PETS."

CAMPING:

Camping is allowed at the following sites: Blackwater State Park, Bear Lake, Hurricane Lake, Karick Lake, Krul Lake and other designated campsites. Some overnight camps require a fee. Some campsites may be closed for maintenance. Contact the Division of Forestry more information at (850) 957-6140.

BAG AND POSSESSION LIMITS: During quota hunts, host hunters and guests must share all bag and possession limits.

1. Deer - Daily limit 2, possession limit 4 (see family hunt and field trial area for exceptions).
2. Wild hog - No size or bag limits.
3. Turkey - Daily limit 1, season limit 2, possession limit 2.
4. Gray squirrel, quail and rabbit - Daily limit 12, possession limit 24 for each game species.
5. Raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk and nutria - No bag limits.
6. Bobcat and otter - Possession limit 1 unless in possession of a Trapping License.
7. Migratory birds - See Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet.

ARCHERY SEASON:

October 17 through November 15.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Hunting license, management area permit, archery permit, wild turkey permit (if hunting wild turkey) and migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds).

Legal to Take - Any deer (except spotted fawn), wild hog, turkey of either sex, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season.

Regulations Unique to Archery Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Hunting with firearms or crossbows is prohibited, except that centerfire shotguns are allowed for hunting migratory birds when one or more species are legal to take (see Migratory Bird section and the current Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet).
2. Hunting deer or wild hog with dogs is prohibited.

SMALL GAME SEASON:

November 14-25, November 30 through December 11 and February 4 through March 7 (except on the field trial area).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Hunting license, management area permit, migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds) and state waterfowl permit and federal duck stamp (if hunting waterfowl).

Legal to Take - Wild hog, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season. Bobcat and otter beginning December 1 until March 1.

Regulations Unique to Small Game Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply. Hunting with centerfire rifles is prohibited.

MUZZLELOADING GUN SEASON:

November 20-22 (except in the field trial area).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Hunting license, management area permit, muzzleloading gun permit, migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds) and state waterfowl permit and federal duck stamp (if hunting waterfowl).

Legal to Take - Deer with at least one antler 5 inches or more in length, wild hog, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season.

Regulations Unique to Muzzleloading Gun Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Only muzzleloading guns are allowed for hunting, except that centerfire shotguns are allowed for hunting during the small game season and for hunting migratory birds when one or more species are legal to take (see Migratory Bird section and the current Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet).
2. Hunting deer or wild hog with dogs is prohibited.

GENERAL GUN STILL SEASON:

November 26-29 and December 12 through February 3 (except in the field trial area).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit (if hunting November 26-29, December 12-20 or January 18 through February 3), hunting license, management area permit, migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds) and state waterfowl permit and federal duck stamp (if hunting waterfowl).

Legal to Take - Deer with at least one antler 5 inches or more in length, wild hog, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season. Bobcat and otter beginning December 1.

Regulations Unique to General Gun Still Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Hunting with dogs, other than bird dogs or retrievers, is prohibited in the still hunt area.
2. Still hunting is allowed in the dog hunt area from December 28 through January 10.

GENERAL GUN DOG SEASON:

November 26-29 December 12-27 and January 11 through February 3 (except in the still hunt and field trial areas).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit, hunting license, management area permit, migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds) and state waterfowl permit and federal duck stamp (if hunting waterfowl).

Legal to Take - Deer with at least one antler 5 inches or more in length, wild hog, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season. Bobcat and otter beginning December 1.

Regulations Unique to General Gun Dog Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

FAMILY STILL HUNT:

December 5-6 (only in that portion of the area north of Highway 4 and east of Highway 191).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit, hunting license, management area permit, migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds) and state waterfowl permit and federal duck stamp (if hunting waterfowl).

Legal to Take - Any deer (except spotted fawn), wild hog, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria, bobcat, otter and migratory birds in season.

Regulations Unique to the Family Still Hunt - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

1. One or two youths (under 16 years of age but not younger than 8 years of age), per quota permit, may hunt under the direct supervision of an adult (at least 18 years of age).
2. A supervisor with proper licenses and permits may hunt, but only in the presence of at least one youth.
3. The bag limit for deer shall be 3 per quota permit; only 1 antlerless deer may be taken per person per day.
4. All hunters must check in at the designated check station prior to hunting and check all game taken.
5. All hunt participants are requested to attend a pre-hunt orientation meeting at the check station the day before the hunt.

QUAIL SEASON:

February 1-4 and 15-18 (field trial area).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit, hunting license and management area permit.

Legal to Take - Quail.

Regulations Unique to Quail Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Hunting quail is prohibited on the field trial area except during quail season.
2. The bag limit for quail on the field trial area is 12 per hunting group each day.
3. A group for the purpose of quail hunting on the field trial area shall include up to 2 persons.
4. Hunting quail after 3 p.m. Central Time is prohibited on the field trial area.

ARCHERY/MUZZLELOADING GUN SEASON:

February 18-28 (except in the field trial area).

January 15-17 (field trial area).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit (if hunting in the field trial area), hunting license, management area permit, archery permit (if hunting with archery equipment), muzzleloading gun permit (if hunting with a muzzleloading gun) and migratory bird permit (if hunting migratory birds).

Legal to Take - Deer with at least one antler 5 inches or more in length, wild hog, gray squirrel, quail, rabbit, raccoon, opossum, armadillo, beaver, coyote, skunk, nutria and migratory birds in season. During the archery/muzzleloading gun season on the field trial portion of the area, any deer (daily bag limit 1) may be taken except spotted fawns.

Regulations Unique to Archery/Muzzleloading Gun Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Only bows or muzzleloading guns are allowed for hunting.
2. Hunting deer with dogs is prohibited.

SPRING TURKEY SEASON:

March 20 through April 25.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Hunting license, management area permit and wild turkey permit.

Legal to Take - Bearded turkey or gobbler.

Regulations Unique to Spring Turkey Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Regulations shall apply.

1. Legal shooting hours are one-half hour before sunrise until 1 p.m.

2. Hunting other animals is prohibited.
3. Hunting with dogs is prohibited.
4. Hunting turkey with centerfire rifles is prohibited.

FOX, RACCOON, OPOSSUM AND BOBCAT SEASON:

May 1 through March 14 (in the fox hunt area only).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit (if hunting during any quota period), hunting license and management area permit.

Legal to Take - Raccoon and opossum. Bobcat from December 1 through March 1.

Regulations Unique to Fox, Raccoon, Opossum and Bobcat Season - In addition to these regulations, all General Area Regulations shall apply.

1. Fox, raccoon, opossum and bobcat may be pursued with dogs during daylight and at night in the designated fox hunt area (see map).
2. Harvesting fox is prohibited.
3. During the time the area is open to raccoon hunting, raccoon or opossum may be taken at night by the aid of a light and dogs, with .22 rimfire firearms other than .22 magnum, or with a single-shot .410 gauge shotgun using shot no larger than No. 6, provided that no firearm shall be loaded at any time except immediately prior to shooting a treed or bayed raccoon or opossum. The hunting of raccoon or opossum under the provisions of this paragraph by display or use of a light from a moving vehicle, boat or animal is prohibited.

TRAPPING: Prohibited.

MIGRATORY BIRD SEASONS:

Rails, common moorhen, snipe, duck, geese, coot, woodcock and crows may be hunted during seasons established by the Commission for these species that coincide with the archery, muzzleloading gun, general gun family hunt or small game seasons. Mourning dove and white-winged dove may be hunted during the first phase of the dove season (Monday through Saturday only), during the second phase (Monday through Wednesday only) and during the third phase (Monday through Wednesday only) until January 1 on posted fields in that portion of the area known as the field trial area and throughout the remainder of the area during seasons established by the Commission for these species.

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Quota permit (if hunting during any quota period), hunting license, management area permit, migratory bird permit, and state waterfowl permit and duck stamp (if hunting waterfowl).

Legal to Take - See Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations pamphlet.

Regulations Unique to Migratory Bird Seasons - In addition to these regulations, all General Regulations shall apply.

1. Hunting duck, geese and coot with lead shot is prohibited.
2. Centerfire shotguns are allowed during established area seasons when one or more migratory birds are legal to take.

FISHING AND FROGGING:

Allowed year-round (except on the fish hatchery).

Permit, Stamp and License Requirements - Fishing license (not required when frogging).

Legal to Take - See Florida Freshwater Fishing Regulations Summary.

Regulations Unique to Fishing and Frogging - All General Area Regulations and General Freshwater Fishing Regulations shall apply. Shooting frogs is allowed only during the listed open hunting seasons and only with the legal methods of take during each particular season.

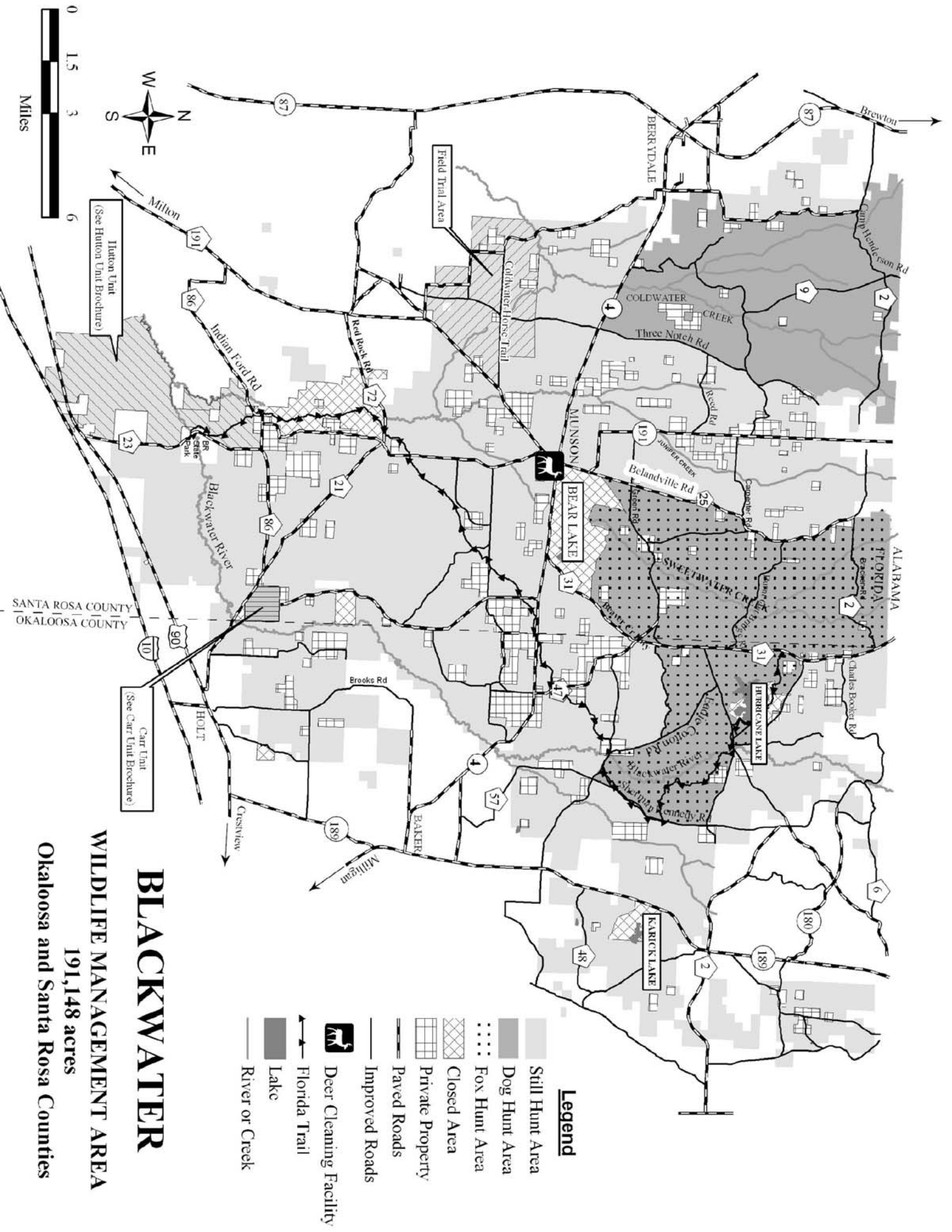
DIVISION OF FORESTRY RULES AND INFORMATION:

1. No person shall operate any vehicle on managed lands controlled by the Division at a speed greater than 30 mph, unless otherwise posted. No person shall operate any vehicle on managed lands except on designated roads, parking areas, or other areas established and specifically identified by the Division.
2. Construction of permanent or semi-permanent structures on state forests is prohibited.
3. The Division of Forestry has an active year-round prescribed burning program on this area. Users are responsible for their personal safety and are encouraged to contact the Division of Forestry for information and location of burn areas, (850) 957-6140.
4. For information on other recreational uses, contact the Division of Forestry at (850) 957-6140.

COOPERATION REQUESTED:

If you see law violators or suspicious activities, contact your nearest Commission regional office or call 1-888-404-FWCC. You may qualify for a cash reward from the Wildlife Alert Reward Association.

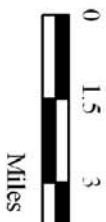
