

County-wide Alligator Harvest Unit Maps





Taylor Wildlife Management Area (WCAs 2A, 2B, 3A, and 3B); within 400 feet of the mean-high or ordinary-high waterline or within 400 feet of emergent vegetation bordering state parks, preserves and reserves; and any private lands included in management programs governed by Rule 68A-25.032, F.A.C. 




