Yellow-naped Parrot *Amazona auropalliata*

The *Yellow-crowned Parrot* (*Amazona ochrocephala*), the *Yellow-headed Parrot* (*A. oratrix*), and the *Yellow-naped Parrot* (*A. auropalliata*) were until recently considered a single species, collectively called the *Yellow-headed Parrot* (*A. ochrocephala*). (See Forshaw [1973] for the single species treatment and AOU [1983] for the split.)

Yellow-naped Parrots, native to the Pacific slope of Mexico to Costa Rica, were not confirmed breeding during the Atlas project, but a courting pair was observed in Dade County (C. W. Biggs, pers. commun.), with possible breeding in Palm Beach County.
