## Graylag Goose     *Anser anser*

The Graylag Goose in Florida is not quite the wild goose of Eurasia, but a domesticated version that occasionally breeds semi-ferrally. No sustainable wild population exists in the state. It occurs on farm ponds, city parks, golf course ponds, and at some petting zoos. Details about its breeding biology in Florida are unknown, a statement that holds for all other exotic goose species.
