Green-cheeked Parakeet *Pyrrhura molinae*

The Green-cheeked Parakeet of Bolivia, Brazil, and Argentina was first observed in Dade County in 1983, when birds were seen examining holes in hollow limbs in Coral Gables (B. Neville, pers. obs.). Fledged young Green-cheeked Parakeets were observed by Nedra Sekera on 16 June 1989 in Brevard County; and breeding is "probable" and "possible" in Dade County.
