Red-lored Parrot *Amazona autumnalis*

A Red-lored Parrot, of the race *salvini*, was observed nesting with a White-fronted Parrot (*A. albifrons*) in a dead palm tree in Coconut Grove, Dade County, for 3 successive years, until the tree was cut down. The Red-lored Parrot was likely the female, as the White-fronted Parrot was not observed entering or leaving the nest during the breeding season. The pair was often observed sitting together and preening each other in a large communal roost several miles from the nest tree during the nonbreeding season. The offspring of this pair have not been identified. (B. Neville, pers. obs.).
