Yellow-crowned Parrot *Amazona ochrocephala*

The Yellow-crowned Parrot (*Amazona ochrocephala*), the *Yellow-headed Parrot* (*A. oratrix*), and the *Yellow-naped Parrot* (*A. auropalliata*) were until recently considered a single species, collectively called the Yellow-headed Parrot (*A. ochrocephala*). (See Forshaw [1973] for the single species treatment and AOU [1983] for the split.)

Yellow-crowned Parrots, native to Honduras, Panama, Colombia, Venezuela, Guiana, Peru, Bolivia, and Brazil, occur in small numbers along the lower east coast of Florida, where breeding was confirmed in 1 quadrangle in Dade County, with "probable" or "possible" breeding in Broward and Palm Beach Counties.
