Order No. EO 16-20

Special Lionfish Removal Opportunity

The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission of the State of Florida, acting under the authority of Article IV, Section 9, of the Florida Constitution, and acting through its Executive Director under Delegations of Authority Paragraph 17 and Paragraph 22, hereby authorizes divers who have harvested, and verified their harvest via an FWC-approved method, 50 or more lionfish during the qualifying period to harvest one spiny lobster in addition to that allowed by the recreational bag limit each day during the 2016 sport season, July 27-28. The qualifying period is May 14, 2016, through the beginning of lobster sport season, July 27, 2016. FWC-approved methods of verifying harvest include submitting a photo of lionfish harvested, including all required information, or submitting harvest documentation at an FWC-approved check point. FWC will issue each harvester that qualifies for this opportunity a commemorative 2016 Lionfish Challenge coin confirming their qualifying lionfish harvest. This opportunity is hereby created as a means to further encourage public involvement in lionfish removal and to reward successful lionfish harvesters around the state. The authorized recreational harvest of spiny lobster during the 2016 sport season is as follows:

1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in 68B-24.004, Florida Administrative Code (FAC), a diver who harvests and reports 50 or more lionfish between May 14, 2016, and the start of the 2016 sport season, July 27, 2016, is allowed to harvest no more than one spiny lobster per day in addition to that allowed by the recreational bag limit. All other persons are subject to the recreational bag and possession limits as specified in 68B-24.004, FAC.
2. For persons who harvest and report 50 or more lionfish during the qualifying period:
 - a. Except in Monroe County and in Biscayne National Park, during the first day of the two-day sport season, no recreational harvester shall harvest more than 13 spiny lobster, or possess more than 13 spiny lobster whether on or off the waters of the state. During the second day of the two-day sport season, no recreational harvester shall harvest or possess while in or on state waters more than 13 spiny lobster or possess more than 26 spiny lobster once such harvester has landed and departed state waters.
 - b. In Monroe County and in Biscayne National Park, during the first day of the two-day sport season, no recreational harvester shall harvest more than 7 spiny lobster, or possess more than 7 spiny lobster whether on or off the waters of the state. During the second day of the two-day sport season, no recreational harvester shall harvest or possess while in or on state waters more than 7 spiny lobster or possess

more than 14 spiny lobster once such harvester has landed and departed state waters.

3. Each harvester in possession of spiny lobster, either on or off the water, in excess of that allowed by the recreational bag limit specified in 68B-24, FAC, must also be in possession of a 2016 Lionfish Challenge coin demonstrating qualifying lionfish harvest.
 - a. Qualifying lionfish must be harvested and reported prior to harvest of a spiny lobster in addition to that allowed under the recreational bag limit specified in 68B-24.004, FAC.
 - b. A 2016 Lionfish Challenge coin may be used to harvest a single lobster in addition to that allowed under the recreational bag limit per day.
4. All other rules of the Commission relating to the lobster sport season (68B-24, FAC) and lionfish (68B-5.006, FAC) shall remain in effect.
5. This order shall take effect at 12:01 A.M. on July 27, 2016 and expire at 12:01 A.M. on July 29, 2016.
