<p>HB 53 by Representative Jacobs</p> <p>SB 232 by Senator Book</p>	<p>Coral Reefs - HB 53 (Representative Jacobs) / SB 232 (Senator Book)</p> <p>These identical bills establish the Southeast Florida Coral Reef Ecosystem Conservation Area. The conservation area includes the sovereign submerged lands and state waters offshore of Broward, Martin, Miami-Dade, and Palm Beach Counties from the St. Lucie Inlet in the north to the northern boundary of the Biscayne National Park in the south.</p>	<p>Both bills have been through all three committee references. HB 53 passed the full House unanimously (Vote: 107 Yeas/0 Nays) on January 25th and was sent over to the Senate. SB 232 was placed on the special order calendar for February 1st; it was substituted for HB 53 and read a 2nd time. HB 53 was read a 3rd time and passed the full Senate unanimously on February 7th (Vote: 35 Yeas / 0 Nays). It was ordered enrolled on February 8th and next goes to the Governor for his action.</p>
<p>SB 168 by Senator Steube</p> <p>HB 145 by Representative Beshears</p>	<p>Nonnative Animals - HB 145 (Representative Beshears) / SB 168 (Senator Steube)</p> <p>These identical bills require FWC to establish a pilot program to mitigate the impacts of priority invasive species by authorizing FWC to enter into competitively bid contracts with individuals and entities to capture and destroy the priority invasive species found on public lands and public waters. The bills require FWC to: ensure that each animal captured and killed is documented, photographed, and the geographic location is recorded for research purposes; direct the disposal of all animals captured and not destroyed; and submit a report of findings and recommendations regarding its implementation of the pilot program to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by January 1, 2021.</p>	<p>These bills had three committee references in both the House and the Senate. SB 168 passed its final committee of reference on January 31st. <i>It was placed on the special order calendar for March 1st and read a 2nd time. An amendment was adopted to make it identical to the House companion bill (removed the appropriation, PIT tag, and pet dealer language). It was read a 3rd time and passed the full Senate unanimously on March 2nd (Vote: 37 Yeas, 0 Nays); it is now in House messages.</i> HB 145 passed its final committee of reference, Government Accountability, on Monday, February 26th. It was placed on the special order calendar for March 2nd; however, it was temporarily postponed on 2nd Reading.</p>

Bill	Description	Action Summary
HB 915 by Representative Henry	<p>These similar bills authorize FWC to designate by rule the timeframe for the expiration of, and the specific design for, the safety inspection decal for vessels. The bill specifies that the decal may not be valid for less than 1 calendar year or more than 5 years, and, at a minimum, meet the standards specified in s. 327.70(2)(a), F.S., which requires the decal to be displayed: within six inches of the vessel's properly displayed vessel registration decal; or for a non-motorized vessel which is not required to be registered, on the forward half of the port side of the vessel above the waterline. Currently, the House bill does not state that all decals issued on or before December 31, 2018 will be invalid and the effective date of the new decals will be January 1, 2019.</p>	<p>The Senate bill had three committee references and the House bill had two committee references. SB 1132 passed its final committee of reference, Appropriations, unanimously on February 22nd. <i>It was placed on the special order calendar for March 1st and read a 2nd time. An amendment was adopted on the Senate floor to specify that a decal may not be valid for less than one calendar year. It was read a 3rd time and passed the full Senate unanimously on March 2nd (Vote: 38 Yeas, 0 Nays); it is now in House messages.</i> HB 915 passed both committees of reference and is still on 2nd reading (will have to be voted on by the full House).</p>
HB 1211 by Representative Abruzzo	Airboat Regulation - HB 1211 (Representative Abruzzo) / SB 1612 (Senator Rader)

<p>SB 1612 by Senator Rader</p>	<p>These similar bills create “Ellie’s Law,” which, beginning July 1, 2019, prohibits a person from operating an airboat to carry passengers for hire on waters of the state unless he or she has all of the following onboard an airboat: a photographic identification card; proof of compliance with the boating safety education course requirements, as provided in s. 327.395, F.S.; proof of successful completion of a commission-approved airboat operator course that meets the minimum standards established by FWC rule; and a certificate of successful course completion in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and first aid. A person issued a captain’s license by the United States Coast Guard is not required to complete the boating safety education course; however, proof of such captain’s license is required to be onboard the airboat when carrying passengers for hire on waters of the state. The House bill provides that a person who violates the airboat operating provisions commits a 2nd degree misdemeanor, punishable by up to 60 days imprisonment or a \$500 fine. The Senate bill provides that a person who violates the airboat operating provisions commits a noncriminal infraction, for which the civil penalty is up to a maximum of \$500. <i>An amendment was adopted to SB 1612 in Appropriations that will exempt a person who is a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe operating an airboat on the reservation-owned or reservation-leased land of such tribe from the requirements specified in the bill.</i></p>	<p>These bills had three committee references in both the House and the Senate. HB 1211 passed its first committee of reference, Careers & Competitions, as a committee substitute (CS) on January 30th. An amendment (technical changes) was adopted by the committee to make it a CS. The reference to the Natural Resources & Public Lands Subcommittee was removed and a reference to the Government Accountability Committee was added; the two remaining committee references were the Government Accountability Committee and the Commerce Committee. HB 1211 passed its second committee of reference, Government Accountability, unanimously on February 22nd. <i>It passed its final committee of reference, the Commerce Committee, on Monday, February 26th. It was placed on the special order calendar for March 2nd and read a 2nd time. It is now on 3rd Reading for March 5th and will be voted on by the full House.</i> SB 1612 passed its second committee of reference, the Appropriations Subcommittee on the Environment and Natural Resources, as a CS on February 14th. <i>It passed its final committee of reference, Appropriations, as a CS on March 2nd.</i></p>
