Subject: Consent Item: Migratory Bird Hunting Regulations, 2017-2018

Purpose:

The purpose of this report is to update the Commission on changes in federal frameworks and staff's proposed rule change for the 2017-2018 migratory bird seasons.

Summary:

Migratory bird hunting regulation frameworks are established by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS). These frameworks provide the foundation of Florida's migratory bird hunting rules. Changes in the federal frameworks generally necessitates conforming action by the Commission to modify Rules 68A-13.003, F.A.C., Hunting Regulations for Ducks, Geese, and Coots or 68A-13.008, F.A.C., Hunting Regulations for Migratory Birds Other than Ducks and Coots. The only changes to the federal frameworks for the 2017-18 migratory bird hunting season are a decrease in the daily bag limit of northern pintails from two to one and an increase in the daily bag limit of black ducks from one to two; therefore, it is recommended that the Commission take action to amend Rule 68A-13.003, F.A.C. to accommodate these changes.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff is requesting Commission approval to advertise the proposed rule amendment and file for adoption as soon as possible. If the rule amendment is approved for both advertisement and final adoption, Commission staff will file the rule for adoption as allowed by s. 120.54(3) Florida Statutes, without further public hearing.
